

College Admission Planning Checklist (Senior Year)

All Year	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Avoid Senioritis <input type="checkbox"/> Continue Researching Careers and Schools That Interest You <input type="checkbox"/> Participate in Extracurricular Activities and Volunteer in the Community <input type="checkbox"/> Apply for scholarships <input type="checkbox"/> Attend college representative meetings at your school as well as college night programs and college fairs <input type="checkbox"/> Take a look at some college applications and consider all of the different pieces of information you will need to compile. <input type="checkbox"/> Visit with your school counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate and fulfill college admission requirements. If you're ahead of schedule, consider taking courses at a local university or community college to get a jumpstart on college credit.
*September to November	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Arrange campus visits to those schools that interest you most (OK to visit more than once) <input type="checkbox"/> Finalize Essays <input type="checkbox"/> Prepare a college living budget <input type="checkbox"/> Narrow down your list of colleges and begin to consider "safe," "reach," and "realistic" schools. Make sure you have the application and financial aid information for each school. <input type="checkbox"/> Take or Retake the ACT/SAT test in the Fall <input type="checkbox"/> Select the schools to which you will apply. Make a list of deadlines for each school. Create a checklist and calendar to chart: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Standardized test dates, registration deadlines, and fees ○ College application due dates ○ Financial aid application forms and deadlines ○ Other materials you'll need for college applications (recommendations, transcripts, essays, etc.) ○ Your high school's application processing deadlines <input type="checkbox"/> Apply for financial aid by completing the FAFSA (and CSS Profiles if necessary) as soon as possible after Oct. 1st <input type="checkbox"/> Check and plan for spring classes that can or might earn you college credit – AP, PSEO, IB, College in the Schools (CIS) <input type="checkbox"/> Ask for recommendations from teachers, counselors, coaches, etc. <input type="checkbox"/> Complete your Activities, Athletic and Academic Profile <input type="checkbox"/> Special Note Some colleges will have deadlines as early as this month. These would include rolling admission, priority, early decision, and early action deadlines. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Finalize and send any early decision or early action applications due this month. Have a parent, teacher, counselor, or other adult review the application before it is submitted.
*December to February	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Apply to at least four but no more than ten colleges <input type="checkbox"/> Apply for School specific scholarships to those schools for which you applied <input type="checkbox"/> Watch the mail for your Student Aid Report (SAR)—it should arrive four weeks after the FAFSA is filed. Review your Student Aid Report (SARS) for accuracy <input type="checkbox"/> Ask your guidance office in January to send first semester transcripts to schools where you applied. <input type="checkbox"/> Don't slack in the classroom. The college that you do attend will want to see your second semester transcript. No Senioritis!
*March to May	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Acceptance letters and financial aid offers will start to arrive. Review your acceptances, compare financial aid packages, and visit your final choices, especially if you haven't already. <input type="checkbox"/> I've been admitted – Now you have to choose. Making a decision by May 1 When you've made your college decision, notify your counselor and the colleges. Send in your deposit by the postmark date of May 1. If you've been offered financial aid, accept the offer and follow the instructions given. Also notify schools you will not attend of your decision. <input type="checkbox"/> Send in any required forms and deposits (especially financial aid and housing)
*Summer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Review orientation materials <input type="checkbox"/> Attend an orientation session <input type="checkbox"/> Register for classes <input type="checkbox"/> Housing – check with the college for lists of what is provided by the school and what the school expects you to provide <input type="checkbox"/> Contact your roommate <input type="checkbox"/> Have your final high school transcript sent to the colleges to which you've applied
